BEYOND THE CLASSROOM

Recent research and community-based learning projects at the Centre for Global Studies have explored:

World Farmers: Working with the London-based NGO World Farmers, students documented the development and purpose of this grassroots organization's work. Students interviewed the farmers about the social, economic and community-based impacts of producing food for household consumption, for community meals and for market. The result was a full-colour booklet that the World Farmers can use to promote their work.

WUSC Public Education Event:

In partnership with Huron's local committee of the World University Service of Canada (WUSC), CGS students organized an event entitled Refugees Welcome: A Public Education Event, to increase the visibility of the work WUSC does related to youth development, education, community empowerment and reducing barriers to education. This event featured a keynote address and workshop on inclusive humanitarianism.
