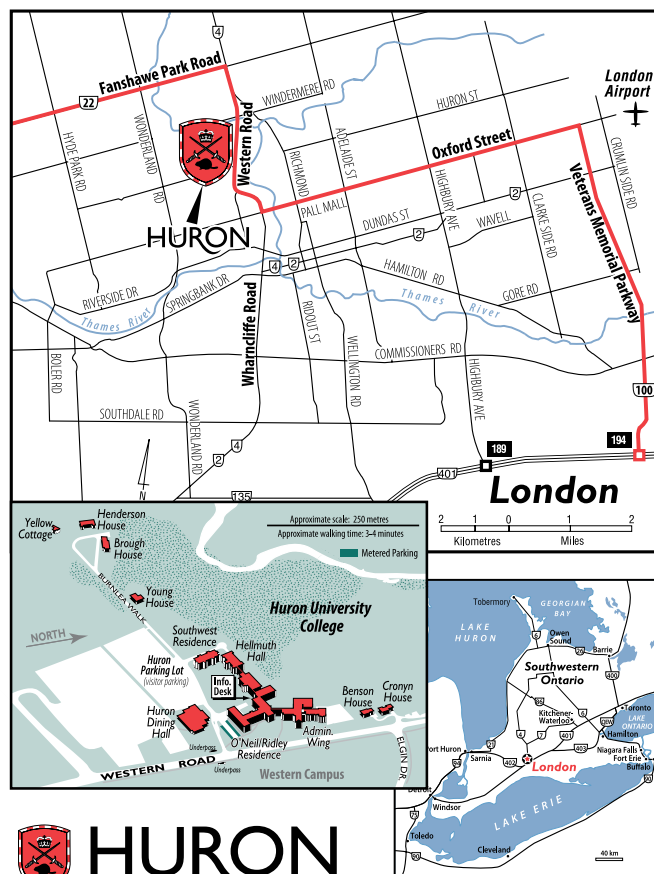
Directions to Huron

From Sarnia/Port Huron

- Take Highway 402 east toward London
- At Exchange 65, leave 402, go north on Highway 22
- Turn right (east) on Highway 22 (Fanshawe Park Road in London)
- Turn right (south) at Richmond Street
- Proceed through two street lights
- Take right onto Western Road
- Proceed on Western Road, past Windemere Road and Elgin Drive. Huron is on the right-hand side.

From Highway 401 from east of London

- Exit Highway 401 at Veterans Memorial Parkway (formerly Airport Road/ Highway 100)
- Proceed north to Oxford Street
- Turn left (west) onto Oxford Street
- Drive to Wharnclyffe Road, turn right (north) onto Wharnclyffe Road
- Wharnclyffe Road becomes Western Road
- Huron is on the left-hand side of Western Road, after Western's main gates

Brough Hall

Nestled in a secluded area on the campus of Huron University College, Brough Hall offers a unique experience for your guests.

Tranquil and private, and with generous facilities for a variety of events, Brough Hall is an ideal location for a retreat, board meeting, reception or gathering.

Brough Hall features eleven bedrooms, a gracious living room, a dining room with seating for 20, a study and an outdoor patio. The facility can be booked in its entirety, or for smaller events we offer the option to book individual bedrooms or the living room or dining room.

Guests can choose to bring refreshments, or make use of the extensive Huron in-house catering services that include full meals, snacks, refreshment and bar services.

History of Brough Hall

Brough Hall was built in 1936 for Mr. Verschoyle Phillip Cronyn, great-grandson of Bishop Cronyn and brother of the famed Canadian actor, Hume Cronyn.

Originally named "Burnlea" the house had four master bedrooms, three staff bedrooms, a three car garage and a small conservatory.

The Tudor-style mansion was built to resemble homes that Mr. and Mrs. Cronyn saw when they traveled throughout Europe. The wrought iron light brackets and chandeliers in the home were purchased in Siena, Italy and are reproductions of fixtures in the Medici Place in Florence. While there have been many changes to the original home, the main rooms have been redecorated to retain their original graciousness.

The home was donated to Huron University College in 1954 and until recently was used as a student dormitory.

Accommodations

Rates range from \$45.00/night for a single bedroom to \$1,000.00 for the entire facility.

ROOMS WITH COMMUNAL/SHARED WASHROOM:

- Two bedrooms with one single bed each
- Two bedrooms with one double bed each
